

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

News in Brief



"Shoulder Surfing" Robbers Caught

Two "Shoulder Surfers" were caught acting suspiciously at the Bank of America on Canoga Avenue in Woodland Hills. Shoulder surfers steal PIN codes by reading over the shoulders of ATM users and memorizing the codes. If a person leaves before completely logging out, the thief punches in the stolen PIN to withdraw cash. The two suspects had actually stolen funds from banks mid-valley, but were spotted in Woodland Hills and arrested by LAPD.

Pinecrest Laying Off 200 Employees

Pinecrest Schools, as we announced in an earlier edition, will be closing the doors of all their five schools in June. School officials notified the state Employment Development Department this month that they will lay off more than 200 people starting in May. The Woodland Hills school at 5975 Shoup Avenue has the largest staff, at 71 people. Pinecrest started in 1951 and at the height of its success had 10 schools in Los Angeles and Ventura. Owner Jeri Dye attributed the closing to a changing education climate, the introduction of charter schools and the inability to keep tuition static.

Viewpoint, Sierra Canyon Named in State's Top 100 Private Schools

Two west valley schools have been named to the list of the top 100 private schools in California. Niche.com has released its 2016 rankings for what it has dubbed the best private high schools in California. Viewpoint School in Calabasas was ranked Number 22 and Sierra Canyon in Chatsworth was ranked Number 30. There are 4,374 private schools in California. Top schools were ranked based on SAT/ACT scores, the quality of colleges that students consider, student-teacher ratio, student and parents reviews and more. Other valley schools that made the list included Harvard-Westlake in Studio City, which was ranked Number 2 in the state, The Buckley School in Sherman Oaks at Number 30, and Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks, which came in Number 81. 



Do as I say, not as I do

Assembly Bill 1887, just introduced by Assembly Member Evan Low (D-Campbell), provides:

"...All agencies, departments, boards, authorities, commissions, the University of California, the Board of Regents, of the University of California and the California State University shall review all requests for state-funded or state-sponsored travel to any state with a law in effect that sanctions or requires discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression.

...Any state-funded or state-sponsored travel to locations described [above] is prohibited, unless that travel is necessary for the enforcement of California law, to meet prior contractual obligations, or for the protection of public health, welfare, or safety.

...The prohibition on state-funded travel described in this section shall continue while any law specified in [above] remains in effect." http://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/faces/billNavClient.xhtml?bill_id=201520160AB1887

Essentially, in common-day parlance, the bill seeks to prohibit state employees (but not Legislators or their staffs; see discussion below) from travelling to any of the 21 states that have adopted versions of the "Religious Freedom Restoration Act", or "RFRA". The act has been adopted in these states with the goal of protecting businesses (such as bakeries) whose owners harbor a strong religious conviction against providing certain services (such as wedding cakes for gay weddings).

I am not concerned here with arguing over whether the RFRA is wrong or right, or whether AB 1887's anti-RFRA provision is wrong or right. Each one of you can decide that issue on your own.

I am concerned here with Legislative hypocrisy. Notice how, in the above language, the wording is very careful so as not to apply to Legislators or their staff. How is it that, if the law is a moral statement against the RFRA, the Legislature has conveniently exempted itself from compliance? Note that this hypocrisy is seen in other areas, too—for example, when Congress enacted the Affordable Care Act in 2009, the national Legislature conveniently exempted itself from the Act with which the rest of us must comply.

I understand that there are occasions when government business would require a Legislator or his staff to travel to "unfriendly" territory. But AB 1887 could have crafted an exception for Legislators or staff when necessary—see, for example, the language of the bill quoted above, which provides that covered state employees can still travel to RFRA states where "travel is necessary for the enforcement of California law, to meet prior contractual obligations, or for the protection of public health, welfare, or safety."

Why could Legislators and staff not be covered by the bill, with a similar type of exception suited to Legislative business necessity? Perhaps Assembly Member Low is afraid his fellow Legislators won't pass the bill if it prohibits them from travelling to swanky conventions in Sun Valley, Idaho or Virginia Beach, Virginia.

AB 1887 is a good example of one of the reasons why the public is so angry this year. Many people feel that our leaders are great at passing nice-sounding laws which, for some reason, usually exempt the leaders themselves.

AB 1887 may be a good idea; on that, I have no comment here. However, a good idea for us common people should, absent some compelling reason to the contrary, also apply to our political leaders. No one, no matter how high his or her position, should be above the law.

"We are taking this action so that we can continue to adapt our business to meet the changing dynamics in the retail industry," Michael Foss, CEO of Sports Authority said. "We intend to use the Chapter 11 process to streamline and strengthen our business both operationally and financially so that we have the financial flexibility to continue to make necessary investments in our operation."

The Englewood, Colorado chain, owned by TSA Stores Inc., has 463 stores nationwide and in Puerto Rico, offering sports goods, footwear, apparel and outdoor equipment.

VICA Supports DWP Increases

The Valley Industry and Commerce Association (VICA) board voted to support the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power's (LADWP) water and power rate increases that were tentatively approved by the Los Angeles City Council Wednesday, VICA President Stuart Waldman said Monday.

VICA recently took a position in favor of the modest, gradual rate increases for residential and commercial customers to address a series of serious challenges to the L.A.'s water and power infrastructure, Waldman said.

"The rate increases are intended to help repair failing pipelines and power lines in need of repair throughout the city of Los Angeles," Waldman said. "Damaged pipelines and power lines pose a significant safety concern for residents and businesses, potentially interrupting services."

Unfortunately, the need for infrastructure repair comes as residents are being asked to cut down drastically on their water usage, Waldman said, which is putting a serious strain on the utility's operating budget.

"L.A. residents have really stepped up, played their part and reduced their water usage for the drought," Waldman said. "However, that effort has turned into significantly

less revenue for LADWP officials, who are in the midst of a major campaign to upgrade infrastructure across the city.

These challenges are being compounded by recent onerous, statewide energy mandates that are pushing operating costs for the utility even higher. Senate Bill 350 requires utility providers to generate 50 percent of their power from renewable sources

they are in perfect working order, will have to be abandoned for renewable-energy facilities – a costly action resulting from these recent mandates.

"While a big part of the need is infrastructure improvements, ultimately, California's nation-leading efficiency standards are part of the cost, as well," Waldman said, urging voters to be mindful of the potential price tag for nation-

Calabasas' Own Ross Porter Now Voice of CSUN Baseball

For Calabasas resident Ross Porter, it's an all-new ball game.

After 28 years as a play-by-play announcer for Los Angeles Dodgers, Porter left the team in 2004 and went into various other announcing gigs.


But Porter was all set for the first pitch of CSUN's opening game on Friday, February 19. His newest job, at the young age of 78, is broadcaster for the university's baseball team.

Porter started his broadcasting career at 14 when he broadcast high school games for Shawnee High School in Oklahoma. At 15, he was elevated to play-by-play man for the football and basketball broadcasts. He was hired after college by WKY radio in Oklahoma City, went on to TV as a sports anchor, and at age 24 became the youngest recipient of the Oklahoma Sportscaster of the year award.

At 27 he arrived in Los Angeles and spent 10 years on KNBC-TV as a sportscaster, winning two Emmy's during his tenure.

He moved up to NBC Sports in the 70's, calling NFL football and Pac-8 basketball.

In 1977 he joined the Dodgers, and spent the next 28 years providing fans with statistical

information on players during the game broadcasts. He was the host of a pregame and postgame radio show for 14 years. "DodgerTalk" answered listeners calls about baseball.

Porter received the Los Angeles Sportstalk Host of the Year four times and was inducted into the Southern California Sports Broadcasters Hall of Fame in 2005 with Vin Scully, his colleague of 28 years, as his presenter.

CSUN baseball head coach Greg Moore, enthusing about having the legend call their games, said, "I'm like a 12-year-old-kid. His voice reminds me of when I was growing up listening to games, playing catch and throwing the ball at the side of the house."

Of his latest job Porter said, "I'm very, very happy about being a part of the CSUN baseball program...I think CSUN's a fine university."

Transparency and Customer Service are also essential cornerstones for a modern municipal utility. Unfortunately, the DWP doesn't have a great track record with either of these. The recent billing scandal and subsequent settlement of a ratepayer lawsuit are obvious, recent examples. It highlights

a DWP culture that is so deeply mired in bureaucracy that it took over a year to resolve problems related to that debacle – including the ability to simply hire enough customer service professionals to meet the need.

I cannot support a rate increase that essentially allows the City to delay governance, transparency and customer service reform.

Asking the ratepayers to pay more while waiting for reform that may never come is just putting the cart before the horse. Reform the governance. Improve the transparency. Provide improved customer service. This is the three-pronged formula for a successful rate increase strategy that I can support. -Councilmember Mitchell Englander

"Barcelona," by playwright Bess Whol, takes place in Barcelona, Spain in the present. The main window of Manuel's apartment overlooks the famous Church of the Holy Family (La Sacrada Familia) which is still under construction. It is an important tourist attraction, one that Irene has on her "must see" list before she returns to the States for her upcoming wedding.

The play begins with a bang, literally, as Manuel and Irene (Carlos Leal and Betty Gilpin) explode on stage, deep in a passionate embrace. It is obvious what is on both their minds, but as the evening and storyline progresses, you discover that there is a cosmic, spiritual reason for their mismatched meeting this particular night. 

Kevin James, "The Inventor," created innovative illusions. Sometimes he used a chainsaw, at other times he did small magic like bringing a little piece of paper to life for a one of the children in the audience.

On the downside, this year's telecast needed some judicious editing. It took too long to get to the main awards of the evening because the show went on well past the allotted three hours. Often less can be more!



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

Soda May Carry Label Warnings

When the science is this conclusive, action should follow, and the State of California would once again be first in the nation to enforce the labeling of health warnings on products. At issue are sugary drinks sold in California – and as with tobacco and alcohol warnings, legislative measure 100 would require warning labels on the fronts of all cans and bottles of soda and juice drinks that have sugar added and 75 or more calories per 12 ounces.

According to the World Health Organization's commissioned study, drinking just one soda a day increases an adult's likelihood of being overweight by 27% and a child's by 55%. Americans, on average, drink more than 45 gallons of sugary beverages a year, according to Dr. Ashby Wolfe of the California Medical Association.

"As physicians, we're desperate to break the cycle of diabetes and obesity we see in our offices every day," Wolfe said. "Consumers have a right to know about the unique health problems associated with soda and sugar drinks." The proposed label would read: "STATE OF CALIFORNIA SAFETY WARNING: Drinking beverages with added sugar(s) contributes to obesity, diabetes, and tooth decay."

At fast-food restaurants with self-serve soda dispensers, the label would be on the dispenser. In a movie theater or business where the dispenser is behind the counter and used by employees, the label would be on the counter. In sit-down restaurants, the label might be on the menus. As with tobacco and alcohol warnings, this legislation will give Californians vital information they need to make

healthier choices. The American Medical Association is in full support, and a spokesperson for the AMA stated he hoped it would become a model for the rest of the country. Over the years, California has pioneered the way at getting residents to eat better; requiring that chain restaurants post calorie information on menus, and also restricting the use of trans fats in restaurants.

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
